Medical/Health & Safety

As you are aware. Mrs Melrose and Dooley are our school first aiders. All other members of staff have been trained in emergency aid and are able to deal with minor incidents that occur. Letters will be sent in the event of your child being involved in a nose bleed, bump to the head or in the event of a more serious incident, you will receive a telephone call. A record is kept in school of incidents and the treatment that is applied. Given that we are outdoors more and encouraging the children to take part in 'risky play', there can often be bumps and bruises. Please be aware that these are considered minor injuries and no cause for concern.

We would also recommend that parents/carers continue to regularly check their child/ren's head for head lice.
