Dear Parents/Carers

This month is very different from last May, where we were in complete lockdown, but had kinder weather conditions. Let's hope the weather improves, given that restrictions are easing.

It is really important that we do not become complacent and adhere to all safety measures that have been put in place for all our safety. Up-to-date signage outside the school, reminds everyone of the importance of wearing masks and maintaining 2m distancing, and we thank you for your support with this. P1/2 continue to enter/exit via the breakfast club door and have the infant playground to themselves. P3/4 and The Hive, enter via the upper playground and leave via the infant door at the end of the school day, to minimise congestion. P5/6/7 enter via the upper school door and will continue to be escorted to the main gate at the end of the school day. I am aware that this can cause some congestion, and would strongly urge that you move on as soon as you meet your child.

Sometimes we make small changes and forget to inform all our contacts. In the event of you getting a new phone number, please ensure you update your contact details on the Parents' Portal. You can also check that all your contact details are up-to-date on this forum.

We have had several children with coughs and sneezes, due to extreme changes in weather conditions. Please respect our position in that we are not medical experts, but have to considerate to all our children's wellbeing, and in this regard, you may receive a call asking you to collect your child as they are presenting with symptoms. In the event of a negative result from a

COVID test, and your child is well enough, they may return to school or nursery, unless advised otherwise by NHS Inform.

Our school first aiders are Mrs Melrose and Mrs Dooley. All staff have had training for emergency aid procedures for school purposes.

We would also request that you check your child's head regularly for head lice.

Community News




LYPP: It's been 5 months since we were last in Bridgend
