Nursery



We have been talking lots about

emotions and feelings. We have been using the story 'The Colour Monster' to help us learn about happiness, sadness, anger, fear, calmness and love. At the start of every session we ask children to identify how they are feeling as part of their self-registration.

Over the past few weeks our children have been interested in babies; how to care for them and Whilst role-playing 'families'. participating in these experiences, our children are developing their imagination and language skills.

Our children love to spend time outdoors every day. As the weather is now getting chillier, we would be grateful if you could ensure your child has a waterproof coat, wellies, hat and gloves each day (all items should be name labelled). We have a supply of waterproof trousers in nursery, however you are welcome to provide your own.

Wellbeing Indicators



We continue to raise awareness of the 8 wellbeing indicators,

Safe, Healthy, Achieving, Nurtured, Active, Respected, Responsible and Included. We have provided information on Safe and Healthy. This month's indicator that we would like to share information on is 'Achieving'. This also falls under UNCRC Articles 4, 8, 28 & 29. Article 4 – Rights are Real, Article 8 – right to an identify (name and nationality), Article 28 – right to an education and Article 29 – right to become the best that you can be.

This means that all children are supported and guided in learning and in the development of skills, confidence and self-esteem, at home, in school and in the community.

Being a Scottish Attainment Challenge School, we continue to strive for the highest achievement for all our learners and ensure they have access to a wide range of learning experiences.

LYPP and staff are providing free after school clubs which are going well. We have just started our second block of Lego Club and first Adventure Club. BPS also have a Coding Club, badminton, Hockey, Multisport club, however, uptake is low. Please encourage your child to attend as this is something where they can develop another skill. If numbers are too low, then we may have to cancel some of the clubs.

We are extremely fortunate to have small numbers in our classes, which ensures a high quality focus on achieving in literacy and numeracy. We will continue to keep you informed of your child's progress and continue to celebrate success.
